The nine principles of Peel Police, Sir Robert Peel, founded London's Metropolitan Police in 1829. He went on to serve as British Prime Minister for two separate terms and earned a reputation as a powerful and effective reformer. In addition to establishing London's first modern and disciplined police force, Peel articulated nine principles of policing that remain as relevant and significant today as they were in the 1830s. Defining the basic mission of policing as prevention, recognizing that the police must win public approval, favoring persuasion and warning about force, and defining success as the absence of crime and disorder rather than with regard to police action - these were all cutting-edge ideas in the 1830s. Peel's nine principles inform the collaborative police view that I believe is essential to heal the divisions that exist between the police and the communities we serve. We will be guided in our efforts to foster shared responsibility for public safety as they progress: Principle 1 - The basic mission for which the police exist is to prevent crime and disorder. Principle 2 - The ability of the police to perform their duties depends on public approval of police actions. Principle 3 - The police must ensure the voluntary cooperation of the public in the voluntary observance of the law in order to ensure and maintain the respect of the public. Principle 4 - The degree of cooperation of the public that can be ensured decreases proportionally to the need for the use of physical force. 5 - Police seek and preserve public favor not by attending to public opinion, but consistently demonstrating absolute impartial service to the law. Principle 6 - Police use physical force to the extent necessary to ensure observance of the law or to restore order only when exercising persuasion, persuasion, and the warning is found to be insufficient. Principle 7 - The police, at all times, must maintain a relationship with the public that gives reality to the historical tradition that the police are the public and the public is the police; the police are only members of the public who are provided to give full-time attention to the functions that correspond to all citizens in the interests of community welfare and existence. Principle 8 - The police must always direct their action strictly towards their duties and never seem to usurp the powers of the judiciary. Principle 9 - Proof of police efficiency is the absence of crime and disorder, not visible evidence of police action in dealing with it.
